

#### **Graduation Requirements**

Students accumulate Carnegie Units towards graduation

- 1 semester = ½ unit
- 1 year = 1 unit
- 4 Units Mathematics
- 4 Units of Science
- 4 Units of English
- 3 Units of Social Studies
- ½ Unit of Health
- ½ Unit of Personal Fitness
- 3 Units of either Fine Arts, Career/Tech (CTE), or World Lang.\*
- 4 Units of Other Electives
- 23 Units Total Required





# How Do Middle and High School Counseling Programs Differ?

#### Many of the same components

- Classroom and individual advisement
- Small group academic and personal/social sessions
- Referral to community agencies
- Transition activities (middle to high, high to post-secondary)
- Parent informational programs
- Parent-teacher-student conferences

#### **Differences**

- Increased emphasis on student accountability and self-advocacy
- Increased exposure to college/career readiness skills

# Keys to Successful High School Experience . . . . Parents

- Stay informed on a regular basis:
  - Infinite Campus, FCHS website (fchstigers.org)
  - Blackboard Parent Portal
- Ask questions if you are unsure of anything!
- Encourage your student to get involved in at least one extracurricular activity in 9<sup>th</sup> grade
- Foster confidence in your teen by gradually transferring responsibility to them for their high school experience


### **Gifted Classes**



- Students must be Georgia qualified in order to take gifted courses at FCHS
- Parents/students choose which gifted classes for the student to take (no limit)
  - Consider student's area of giftedness
- To change from gifted to regular or vice versa, send an email request to Dr. Armour (<u>armour.curtis@fcboe.org</u>)
- Honors courses available for 9<sup>th</sup> grade students:
  - (9<sup>th</sup> Lit, Accelerated Math and Advanced Placement)
- Students must receive at least a 70 in a gifted classes to remain eligible for gifted services in that subject area
- Eligibility requirements are listed on the FCBOE website www.fcboe.org
- Gifted testing window: May 7-May 18
  - Contact Bennett's Mill to initiate testing

#### **SCIENCE EMPHASIS**

- 9<sup>th</sup>: Biology
  - Regular, Gifted
- 10<sup>th</sup>: Chemistry
  - Regular, Gifted
- 11<sup>th</sup>: Physics/AP Physics
- 12<sup>th</sup>: Any AP Science or Anatomy and Physiology
- Students may double up on science beginning 11<sup>th</sup> grade.

#### **NON-SCIENCE EMPHASIS**

- 9<sup>th</sup>: Biology
  - Regular
- 10<sup>th</sup>: Physical Science
  - Regular
- 11<sup>th</sup>: Environmental Science, Earth Systems, or Chemistry
- 12<sup>th</sup>: Science elective
- Chemistry in 11<sup>th</sup> → Hope rigor science classes, including AP courses available for 12<sup>th</sup>.


- 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Literature and Composition (Survey)
  - Regular, Gifted/Honors\*, Remedial
- 10<sup>th</sup>: World Literature and Composition
  - Regular, Gifted\*
- 11<sup>th</sup>: American Literature and Composition
  - Regular, AP Language\*
- 12<sup>th</sup>: English Literature and Composition
  - Regular, AP Literature\*

\*Requires summer assignments

## **Social Studies Curriculum**

- 9<sup>th</sup>: No requirement
- 10<sup>th</sup>: World History
  - AP World History
- 11<sup>th</sup>: United States History
  - AP US History
- 12<sup>th</sup>: Economics/American Government

# **Electives Curriculum**


- World Language
  - French, German, Spanish
  - If taking Spanish I this year and passed, cannot be repeated!
- Fine Arts
  - Band, Chorus, Drama, Orchestra, Visual Art
- Career, Technical Education (CTE)
  - Automobile Maintenance & Light Repair, JROTC, Audio/Video Tech & Film, Animation & Digital Media, Entrepreneurship, Business & Technology, Health Science, Computer Science, Engineering & Tech, Culinary Arts
- Academic Electives
  - Debate, World Geography
- You are making requests, not registering for electives classes!
- Freshmen have low scheduling priority! Will get required courses, but not necessarily electives.
- Please select alternates (6-8)

# **Electives Pathway Declaration**

- Freshmen are encouraged to declare a pathway. (All of 8<sup>th</sup> Grade-Team A has completed this process; Team B is in process).
- Beneficial if you have a desire to complete 3-4 years in the same electives area.
- Will have priority in getting the first year course in that pathway.
- May only declare one pathway.
- Report your pathway selection on Infinite
   Campus during electives requests
