School wide Title I Program. In October of 2017, Flat Rock Middle School changed from Title I - Targeted Assistance school to a Title I - School wide Program. It means that all students can receive additional services. No student identification is made that renders them eligible or ineligible for services. The program promotes improved instruction for all students and constitutes comprehensive school reform and strategies that:

- Provide opportunities for all children to meet proficient and advanced levels of student academic achievement.
- Strengthens the core academic program
- Increases the amount of learning time
- Includes strategies to address the needs of all children in the school, but particularly low achieving children and those at risk of not meeting state standards
- High qualified teachers in all core content area classes
- Strategies to increase parental involvement, such as literary services

School wide program provides staff and parent involvement in program planning and evaluation, as well as academic involvement, required parent involvement activities, and family literacy. It means that teachers provide additional in-class small group instruction for both reading and math for students who are not on grade level.

The Parent Involvement Plan 2018'-2019'

The parent involvement plan is a collaborative process working with parents and staff to provide opportunities to enhance student learning. These opportunities are provided throughout the year at various meetings including the annual Title I meeting, The Title I stakeholders meetings and through parent feedback given through surveys, conferences phone calls and visits to the PRC, (Parent Resource Center).

School - Parent Compact:

The compact describes the role of the student, parent and the school. It is distributed the first week of school and is designed to ensure the academic success of the student by ensuring accountability upon signature. It is created with input from parents and educators and reviewed annually at the Title I stakeholders meeting for changes.

Title I – Extended Day Program -

We will continue to have our Extended School Program on Reading and Math in the **Spring of 2019**. Teachers in these courses meet the student’s instructional need through strategies such as remediation and acceleration using a variety of supplemental activities including, but not limited to GA MILESTONES Coach resources, USATestPrep, IXL, Study Island etc.

Parent Teacher Team Meeting. (PTTM). The Parent Power Series consists of two meetings; one in the fall and one in the spring. They are sponsored by Title I and are geared toward informing, empowering and engaging parents in their students learning process by offering sessions related to technology, preparation for milestones along with opportunities to meet with their child’s teacher *to discuss data on reading and math performance and plan for Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, Timely, (S.M.A.R.T.) goals.*
