## What is Title 1?

North Fayette is identified as a Title 1 school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education act of 1965 (ESEA). Title 1 supports state and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards. Our goal: reinforce, enhance, and improve teaching and learning for all students, including those from homeless, migrant, or other at-risk populations. Planning for Title 1 programs is done jointly with parents and staff.

  7. Housed in the office and parent center
- Maintain the North Fayette Parent Involvement website with accurate and timely information for parents to stay informed, see workshop dates, and give online feedback.
- Hold meetings and workshops at various times (such as in the mornings and evenings), in various formats (such as offered online and in-person, as well as home visits), offer transportation when possible, and childcare services, and address opportunities for regular meetings if requested by parents.
- Hold Parent Workshops specific to the GA Milestones testing standards so parents are prepared to help their children.
- Communicate with families on a regular basis including phone messages, email, conferences, and share information on the school website and in the parent center about our School Improvement Plan, Title 1 Plan, and Parent Involvement Plan so that parents are involved of the goals that North Fayette is attaining.
- Announce all volunteer opportunities available at North Fayette through the parent involvement website, social media, newsletters, emails, the office, and the Parent Center.
- Hold student led conferences to explain your child's progress and review assessments and strategies so that parents can work with their child to monitor and meet academic needs.
- Provide necessary materials for parents at conferences and meetings to help parents work with their child to improve student achievement. Backpacks with supplemental materials can be sent home weekly for parents to use with their child per parent request or teacher recommendation.
- Convene an Annual Title Meeting, a midyear Title 1 Planning Committee meeting, and a Title 1 End of the Year meeting for parents to collaborate on parent involvement policy and be informed of ongoing developments at North Fayette and county-wide.
- Involve parents in the decision of how to spend the One Percent Parent Involvement Funds and listen and collect parent requests for workshops and other activities through our annual parent survey, comment cards placed in the office & Parent Resource Center and our stakeholder meeting.
- Make a Parent Resource Center to provide parents with resources, computer access, and input from a certified teacher to help with ongoing learning for their children.
- Partner with Head Start and other Pre K programs offering parent engagement activities and summer bridge workbooks to help prepare parents and their children for the transition to Kindergarten.
