

1. Are you the parent of a brand new sixth grader? Is this your first experience as a middle school parent? Not sure what to expect? Or maybe you have older middle schoolers, but have a few questions about what's happening with them during these years.

SOLAR ECLIPSE ON AUGUST 21, 2017

FRMS will be viewing the Solar Eclipse outside with students who have a signed permission slip. This is a natural event that takes place on Earth when the moon moves in its orbit between Earth and the Sun. During an eclipse, the Moon's shadow moves across Earth's surface. Viewers are not to ever look at

the Sun directly during an eclipse unless it is during a total solar eclipse phase, when the Moon completely obscures the sun. The skies will gradually begin to darken as the moon moves into the sun's path. Over time the sky will become increasingly dark. Once it is over, the skies will gradually become filled with more light as the moon moves out of the path of the sun. The bright light of the Sun during any period of an eclipse can damage your eyes very quickly even if it doesn't hurt. We will have special solar eclipse glasses provided for all students and staff that are outside to view. We are really excited that our students will have the opportunity to make observations and connections during integrated learning in class during this rare event.
