FRMS GERMAN STUDENTS HUMBLE THE HIGH-SCHOOLERS!

Shanava Hirani and Sydney Schulten, students in 8th-grade German 1 at Flat Rock Middle School, took two first-place medals in direct competition against high-school entrants at Clemson University's 45th Annual Foreign Language Declamation Contest.

Competing students must memorize and recite two rounds of poems before a panel of university faculty judges. A first-place award means that the student delivered a polished, convincing performance, not just a dry recitation. The German 1 competition was divided into two cohort groups; competing in different groups, Sydney and Shanaya bested older competitors from several of the Southeast's finest German programs, winning *first* in each cohort.

The Clemson Declamation Contest is the largest such event in the eastern US. This year, over 450 students from 32 schools in three states competed in nine languages. Shanaya and Sydney are students of William Bryan, teacher of German at Flat Rock and at Sandy Creek High School.
