

Richard Woods, Georgia's School Superintendent "Educating Georgia's Future" State School Superintendent Richard Woods has selected 142 Georgia students to serve on his 2017-2018 Student Advisory Council. Throughout the school year, these middle and high school students will meet with Superintendent Woods to discuss the impact of state policies in the classroom.

Members of the Student Advisory Council will also discuss other issues related to education, serve as the Superintendent's ambassadors to their respective schools, and participate in service projects to benefit schools and students.

Members were selected from a pool of more than 1,500 students who applied to serve on the council. Students were chosen based on the strength of their essay answers, which focused on their ideas for public education as well as their community service experience. The students selected attend public schools all over the state.

### **SCREENAGERS**



It is never too late to start a conversation about technology with your children. That is why Fayette County is participating in the showing of the 60 minutes film of "Screenagers," created by Physician and filmmaker Delaney Ruston.

Screenagers, gives a closer look at how families are coping with the negative impact of screen time and how being connected to devices is affecting child development. Free community showings of the film will be hosted by our high schools; all parents, teachers, students ages 4-12 and community stakeholders are invited to attend. Spanish captions will be shown at MHS and SCHS. A short student-led discussion will follow.





Flat Rock is using *PBIS Rewards* to support our PBIS program. PBIS Rewards is a technology-based Management System that helps us with our behavior incentive program. You can learn about PBIS Rewards at their website (www.pbisrewards.com).

Rewards. Our students can earn rewards throughout the day by meeting behavior expectations. These rewards are in the form of electronic points. They can redeem these points for privileges, tangible items, access to events, and other similar things. Our expectation is that we will see overall sustained improvement in our climate throughout the school and that the number of behavior referrals will decrease as a result of this implementation.

Would you like to track your child's points? PBIS Rewards has a Parent App that will give you some insight into how your child is doing with respect to our PBIS program. The Parent App will run on most smart devices, including smartphones and tablets. You can find it in the iPhone/iPad App Store, Google Play, and the Amazon App Store. Just search for "PBIS Rewards Parent."

Once you have installed the app, you will need to confirm your relationship with your child by scanning a personalized QR code. Ms. Quance will print the code and send it home with your student. Once you have done this you will be able to see your child's progress with the system.
