Get Connected and Stay Plugged In with Flat Rock Middle School

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Dear Families,

There have been many concerns about the long lines at our morning drop-off area. When the traffic movement at the drop-off is slow, many cars are backed up from both directions on Jenkins Road. We are asking for your patience and cooperation as it is critical to the success of what we are trying to accomplish in allowing all students ample time to enter safely and on time.

Students are to exit the vehicle at the drop-off/pick-up area from the passenger side of the vehicle along the curb. The drop-off/pick-up area begins in front of the gym concession doors. We ask that you not hold your student in the car until they reach the end of the drop-off, because this slows the process and creates back-log. As you are traveling along the curb area, please stay alert as you move. Believe me, the traffic moves quickly and efficiently when students are all released at one time along the curb.

We have staff stationed along the drop-off/pick-up area to assist in moving traffic along and support students who may have needs. I ask that you cooperate with them. They are there for the safety of your children and adults. Also, please do not park in the parking lot and have your student get out of your vehicle to cross traffic. This is not safe.

We appreciate your help and know that we all want to maintain a safe environment for everyone. As long as we are all working together, everything will work well. Thank you in advance for your help.


