

Dear Flat Rock Families,

I hope this letter finds you well, considering the uncertain events surrounding us in our country, state, and local areas. We have reached the end of our second week in this journey of virtual learning, and I have seen very positive and active learning within the online platforms every day. Our instructional staff continue to design and monitor engaging lessons while our students are logging in regularly. We appreciate you, our parents, who have taken on the role of "home school teacher", when this was not the job you signed up to do. Thank you for all of your efforts.

Effective Monday, March 30, we will utilize a different instructional and academic support framework going forward for our students and teachers. As we've listened and received feedback from parents and teachers, we found it necessary to make some changes and communicate more clearly what is expected. Please know that we are here for you in any capacity to support you throughout this time. We want students to stay plugged in to learning, but we realize that there must be balance for everyone in order to maintain the pace that we may be on for a while. Please see below for the **Middle School Student Expectations of Virtual Learning Days.** I am pleased to share that over 85% of our students are having regular school participation virtually. This allows students to remain on track and continue to learn. This also helps to bring a sense of 'normalcy' during a time when there isn't much that is normal about the day for our students. As teachers and staff continue to connect, keep in mind that we are in our 4th nine-week period, as of March 16, so students are in a different Connections class than before we left.

The week of April 6th -10th is our normally scheduled Spring Break and Fayette County schools will be closed virtually during that time. We want our students and staff to have a break from the world of school and learning. There will be no instruction or business taking place. We will, however be back up and running via our virtual platforms on Monday, April 13, 2020.

As additional layers of protection are considered, our system is very aware of the volatiity of the current situation and because we want to do our part in protecting our children and our greater community, we have closed off all facilities to the public. This means that our fields, tracks, and parking lots are no longer open for the community to use during this time, per the directive of our local jurisdiction.

Our staff and community are working incredibly hard to ensure the safety of our students and to keep them engaged educationally. We are all in this together. Stay plugged in to what's happening behind the scenes around Flat Rock

Middle School Student Expectations for Virtual Learning Days

- Students should expect to have up to 120 minutes of work/activities/assessments each week per class. Assignments for that class day will be posted on Blackboard prior to 8am. Students should plan to check their FCBOE email and log into Blackboard daily. Formative assessments and grades will continue to be assigned and given. Teachers will be available to answer questions during office hours from 1:00 to 4:00 pm every non-instructional day. This may be via email or live on the teacher-platform that they use..
- Teachers will have active instruction using Blackboard Collaborate or Zoom according to the following schedule:
 - a. Monday- English Language Arts
 - b. Tuesday- Math
 - c. Wednesday- World Language/CTE/Fine Arts/PE-Health (Connections)
 - d. Thursday- Science
 - e. Friday- Social Studies

(Sessions will be recorded and posted on Blackboard if a student is unable to participate live)

- Teachers will use Blackboard Collaborate or Zoom for virtual instruction sessions with students: There is a designated day for each subject for assessments and active classroom participation.
- 4. Students should complete assignments 24 hours before the next scheduled class for that subject.



Chromebook support

In order to provide our students and staff with the tools they need to access their learning resources, the Technology Services Department will provide a Chromebook drop off and spare replacement program during our school closures.

Parents can drop off student Chromebooks at the Technology Services (VoTech) building parking lot from 10 am - 2 pm, Monday through Friday. The drop off will be available until March 31, this may change as we learn more about closure timelines. If a Chromebook is found to need repair, a replacement Chromebook will be issued at the drop-off area. Damaged or missing chargers will not be replaced – this is the responsibility of the student/parent to be purchased (We will be able to provide that information, but we will not be providing chargers).
