Have you noticed that more and more kids are having difficulty figuring things out for themselves? Could it be they're being robbed of the opportunity to do so?

A mom I know has helped with registration at the local high school for the past ten years. This year she saw a whole new breed of parents. Rather than the kids signing themselves up, the parents were making all of the decisions.

When the students were being assigned lockers, one dad who was there to "help" his son insisted that he, the dad, did not like the location of the assigned locker. When the son said he thought it was fine, the dad turned to him and said, "Shut up, you don't know what you're talking about."

This was just one of the many things this mom witnessed. She went home exhausted, and very sad: sad for a generation of kids who are being robbed of the opportunity to figure things out for themselves, and sad for our country.

When parents do all the thinking, they rob kids of the opportunity to learn from their mistakes and send the message that the kids are not capable of figuring things out for themselves. Give your kids the can-do message: Let *them* do the thinking. When they learn from their mistakes, they build character, strength, and confidence.

The <u>Community for Creativity at Flat Rock Middle School</u> will use Project-Based Learning and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) Education to foster creativity and innovative thinking in ALL students.

Community for Creativity Goals:

- Prepare students to excel in STEAM career fields by developing the skills required for college and career readiness
 communication, collaboration, critical & creative thinking, and problem solving
- Make learning relevant, engaging, and interdisciplinary by allowing students to develop solutions to real-world problems
- Build community and industry partnerships that will support the Community for Creativity, connect students to Georgia's creative industries, and provide students real career opportunities
- Create learning experiences that align with the career pathways at Sandy Creek High School and other Fayette County Schools
- Increase understanding and awareness about Georgia's creative industries as well as the benefits and importance
 of STEAM proficiency

Successful, qualified candidates are typically A/B students who are naturally inquisitive, enjoy solving problems, and are comfortable learning in a fast-paced, rigorous, cooperative learning environment.

The sixth, seventh, and eighth grade STEAM teams at FRMS will be comprised of approximately 65-70 students per grade, who will be selected from voluntary applications throughout Fayette County (see FRMS website). The application window opens May 1 and closes May 22. Students will be notified whether or not they have been placed on the STEAM team by Friday, June 7. All STEAM candidates will be administered a Motivation Inventory Assessment that will be a part of the rubric for admission.

Los candidatos exitosos y calificados suelen ser estudiantes A / B que son naturalmente curiosos, disfrutan resolviendo problemas y se sienten cómodos aprendiendo en un entorno de aprendizaje cooperativo, riguroso y acelerado.

Los equipos STEAM de sexto, séptimo y octavo grado en FRMS estarán compuestos por aproximadamente 65-70 estudiantes por grado, quienes serán seleccionados de las solicitudes voluntarias en todo el Condado de Fayette (consulte el sitio web de FRMS). La ventana de solicitud se abre el 1 de mayo y se cierra el 22 de mayo. Se notificará a los estudiantes si se los ha colocado o no en el equipo de STEAM antes del viernes 7 de junio. Todos los candidatos de STEAM recibirán una Evaluación de inventario de motivación que formará parte de la rúbrica para el ingreso.
