#### DRESS CODE REMINDER

Students are expected to dress and be groomed in such a way as to reflect neatness, modesty, cleanliness, and respect for our school. Students must ensure that their dress does not distract or cause disruption in the educational program or orderly operation of the school. School administrators are responsible for determining dress code violations. The principal may interpret or add to these provisions as he/she deem to be in the best interest of the school, students or the educational process. The complete dress code rules may be viewed in the Student Handbook here.

It is particularly important to review the following dress code items due to recent and repeated school violations, particularly with leggings and stressed jeans:

Pants, shorts, slacks, shirts, dresses and skirts will be of appropriate size and fit. Holes and stressed areas must be below the fingertips or mid-thigh. Pants and shorts must always be on the waist. The hem of skirts, dresses or shorts must be at or below the fingertips or mid-thigh.

<u>Clothing that is extreme form fitting (leggings, yoga pants, jeggings, compression shirts, etc.) must be worn with an outer</u> garment of appropriate length. See pictures below for guide.



### What's your answer to the following question?

<ul> <li>Kids need limits.</li> <li>Limits are best set through actions instead of hollow threats.</li> <li>When kids make poor decisions, they need to experience natural or logical consequences.</li> <li>Consequences are always more effective when provided with loving empathy.</li> <li>Our kids will learn how to live their lives by watching us.</li> </ul> Listed below are a few examples of essential limits: <ul> <li>You may have your tablet as long as there is no arguing when I ask you to shut it off.</li> <li>Feel free to have a cell phone when you can pay for the entire cost.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>We allow kids to have their internet-connectable devices as long as they check them in with us each night. We'll return them in the morning as long as there are no problems.</li> <li>I've met plenty of good people who've ended up doing bad things on the internet. That's why your mom has all of my passwords and is free to see my history. You may have this device as long as you do the same. Everyone needs someone to hold them accountable.</li> <li>I'm shutting my phone off so that I can give you 100% of my attention. Thanks for doing the same.</li> </ul>



What is PBIS? (Positive Behavior Intervention and Support)

School-wide PBIS is a proactive systematic approach that has been found to support a positive school climate. At Flat Rock, we strive to Be Responsible, Be Respectful, and Be Safe.

Flat Rock is using **PBIS Rewards** to support our PBIS program. PBIS Rewards is a technologybased Management System that helps us with our behavior incentive program. You can learn about PBIS Rewards at their website (<u>www.pbisrewards.com</u>).



Our students can earn rewards throughout the day by meeting behavior expectations. These rewards are in the form of electronic points. They can redeem these points for privileges, tangible items, access to events, and other similar things. Our expectation is that we will see overall sustained improvement in our climate throughout the school and that the number of behavior referrals will decrease as a result of this implementation.

The faculty and staff are eager and ready to acknowledge students for the many positive actions and choices that they make every day. We encourage you to talk with your student about what they must do to be successful with PBIS Rewards and to encourage them when you see them being successful.
