

# **Little League World Series Update**

The Peachtree City Little League team, representing the Southeast Region has reached the semi-finals of the Little League World Series. Flat Rock's very own Tai Peete (#7) has been a major part of the team's success.

The team lost their first game of the double elimination tournament, but the SE has gone on to win their last four games in a row. On Saturday, August 25th the Peachtree City team will once again face Hawaii, the only undefeated team and the only team to defeat the Peachtree City team. The winner of Saturday's game will represent the entire United States in the final game of the Little League World Series.

Tai plays shortstop and pitcher. Pitching against the New York team (NW), in their third game, Tai Peete led the team to the win for the Southeast. Tai went three innings, allowing zero runs on one hit, striking out five and walking one. In the game on August 23th, Tai was credited with the mound victory for Southeast. He worked five innings, allowing seven hits, and three runs, while striking out five, and walking one. At the plate through the five games Tai has 2 runs batted in and has a batting average of .412.


