I recently walked past a playground and heard all the little kids exclaiming almost the same thing to the adults nearby, "Look at me! Watch me!"

Do human beings have a need to feel noticed, significant, and validated? Do we often work hard to gain these feelings?

If this were not true, do you suppose people would be willing to compromise so much dignity just to get on camera for a moment, or to "star" in a reality show?

If only there were a way to meet this powerful human need without making our kids feel embarrassed or patronized.

This is where the One-Sentence Intervention comes in. This powerful Love and Logic skill is all about meeting the need to feel *noticed or significant*. We can simply walk up and notice something true about the young person and then move on like it's no big deal. Interests are great things to notice — for example, "I noticed that you play soccer a lot."

As you might guess, we must take care to balance the meeting of that need with another powerful driver of human behavior — the fear of feeling embarrassed. We all know kids who don't want to be called on, shown off to friends, or given praise publicly.

For that reason, we often whisper things we notice to kids or catch them as they are walking by so there is less chance the encounter will make them feel uncomfortable. The more subtle and less like a technique it feels to the young person, the better. Don't wait for or expect a response from the child. That's not the point. We want to come across as caring adults who take a sincere interest in our kids.

Have fun experimenting with this skill!

Deadline to purchase Chromebook insurance has been extended to 9/16/19.

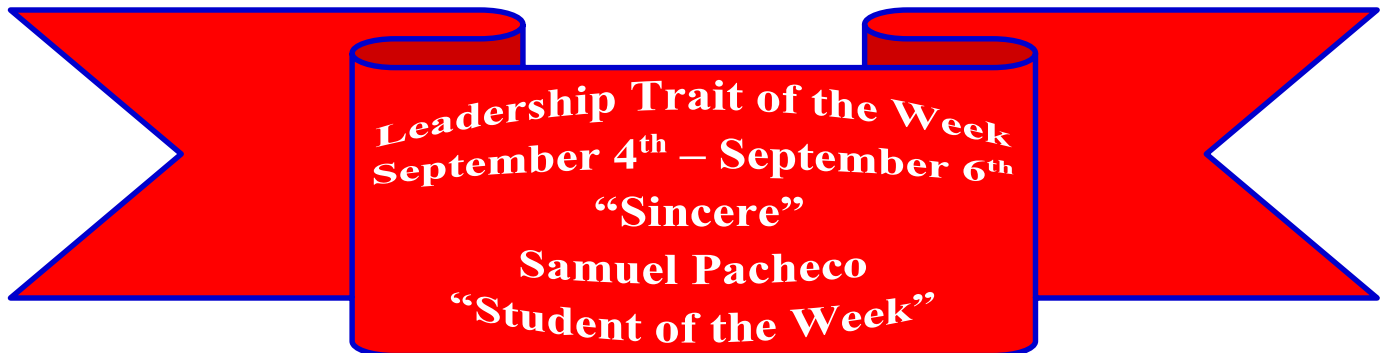
