Recently, The USDA's Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 has required updates to Local School Wellness Policies. The Act requires each local educational agency participating in the National School Lunch Program or other federal Child Nutrition programs to establish a local school wellness policy for all schools under its jurisdiction.

Fayette County Public Schools has issued a Board-approved updated Wellness Policy to this effect. Each school has been asked to form a Wellness Committee and to meet the goals of the local wellness policy. The Committee is required to evaluate their school using online evaluation tools found at <u>www.healthiergeneration.org</u>.
