- → **Seniors:** remember early January college application deadlines! If a recommendation letter is needed, please ask a teacher before Thanksgiving break.
- → **Seniors**: Are you interested in attending a HBCU? Consider attending the Annual HBCU Festival November 17th through 18th. Click here-for more information.
- → Seniors: "Georgia Apply to College" month is during the month of November. Many colleges/universities/technical colleges in the state of Georgia offer free/reduced application fees during this month. Check on the list here for fee waivers. We will also host Apply to College Day on November 14th! Sign up to participate and get help with the application process. Look in the Cat Chat for more information.
- → Seniors: The FAFSA should open in December. If you are planning to go to any post-secondary institution, then your family will need to complete the FAFSA. - → Current 9th through 11th graders: Interested in learning more about dual enrollment?
