IMPORTANT NEWS AND REMINDERS

- → **Seniors:** As a courtesy, students should ask teachers and counselors for recommendation letters at least 3 weeks prior to the application deadline.
- → Homecoming week: September 30th-October 4th
- → College Application Team (CAT): Seniors, CAT time will be held after school in the Counseling Suite from 3:45-4:30 on Wednesdays during the month of October. This is the perfect opportunity to get one-on-one help with college applications. CAT Time will start again in February and March for those students applying to college during 2nd semester.
- → 11th grade career counseling lessons: Counselors will meet with 11th graders through US History/AP US History courses to identify in high demand careers available.
