In 2010, Georgia's General Assembly passed the BRIDGE law to promote career awareness and the development of individualized plans of studies for all Georgia middle and high school students.

Each year students must complete a grade specific activity and update their plan of study. The senior bridge bill requirement is the senior survey (completed in Qualtrics in April 2024).

GAFutures (SAT score)

- To upload your SAT score report using the GAfutures' Document Upload feature, follow these steps:
- Print your test score report from <u>College Board's website</u> for the SAT.
- Sign, date and write this statement on the report: "This is a true and exact copy of the original score report."
- Save your document(s) as one file (Acceptable file types: pdf, jpg, jpeg, png, bmp, tif, tiff).
- Sign into your GAfutures account and select **Document Upload**, located on the left-hand side of the page.
- Select the Document Type: SAT scores.
- Attach your document file and select the submit button.

GAFutures (ACT score)

- To request ACT to submit your score report to GSFC electronically, follow these steps:
- Go to <u>ACT.org</u> and sign into your account.
- Select your ACT score report be sent to GSFC by entering the recipient code: 2225
- ACT will then send GSFC an electronic file to update the student's record.

College Visits

- 1. Make an appointment with the College Admission Office
- 2. Obtain a College Visitation form from Attendance
- 3. Have the form signed by your teachers, parent, and college official
- 4. Return the signed form to the attendance office by the next school day.

Senior Meetings

- Each student will meet with his/her counselor and discuss the following:

What your student will receive:

- -Senior Survival Guide
- -Unofficial transcript (with HOPE GPA at bottom)
- -Scholarship opportunities (located on Naviance)

How to Apply to College

- 1. Choose 3-5 schools and visit their websites
- 2. Check admissions requirements and deadlines
- 3. Apply online (using Common Application or directly on the college's website)
- 4. Send official transcripts
- 5. Send SAT/ACT scores directly from testing site. What about test optional schools?
- 6. Have someone proofread the application before submitting
- 7. Request recommendations if school requires them
- 8. Print copy for your records

Common Application

- A large application that can be completed once and sent to many different colleges/universities (over 1,000 colleges/universities have a partnership with Common Application)
- Some schools are CA exclusive; some allow you to apply either via CA or on the school's website. If there are 2 methods of application, the choice is up to the student.
- If a student uses CA, they will need to match CA with Naviance.
 - All supplemental materials (transcript, letters of recommendation, school profile) are sent through Naviance.

Requesting a Transcript

 Transcripts can be requested online at <u>www.gafutures.org</u> or through Naviance at NO Cost.

For all other transcripts:

- Complete a "Request for Transcript" form (in Counseling Office)
- Pay \$3.00 fee for each transcript
- Allow 2 days for the requests
- Picking up and mailing of transcript is the student's responsibility
- Opening of the envelope invalidates the transcript

Transcripts with 1st semester grades will be available after January 29, 2024

Letters of Recommendation

- Prepare a comprehensive "Brag Sheet" and share with teachers and counselor
- Allow 3 weeks for completion of recommendation (most colleges do not require a counselor recommendation)
- Need a recommendation letter before semester break (remember those January college deadlines)?

December 1, 2023 is the **DEADLINE** to request a recommendation from your counselor and teachers

Brag Sheet

Brag Sheet in the School Counseling course in Schoology. Make a copy in Google drive. Fill it out and share with teachers and counselor. Most students completed the brag sheet in Spring 2023 through English class at WHS. Review before sharing with teachers/counselor.

FAFSA

- The 2024–25 FAFSA changes include the following: Opens December 2023
- Every contributor—anyone (student, the student's spouse, a biological or adoptive parent, or the parent's spouse) who's required to provide information on the FAFSA form—will need an FSA ID to access and complete their section of the online form.
- All contributors must provide consent and approval to have their federal tax information transferred directly into the student's FAFSA form via direct data exchange with the IRS. If any contributor doesn't provide consent and approval, submission of the FAFSA form will still be allowed. However, a Student Aid Index, which replaces the Expected Family Contribution, will not be calculated and the student won't be eligible for federal student aid.
- Students will be able to list up to 20 colleges to receive Student Aid Index.
- Users can start or access the FAFSA form by visiting StudentAid.gov and logging in, where they'll see the link to the FAFSA form on their Dashboard.

FAFSA continued

- The purpose of completing the FAFSA is to:
 - Apply for the HOPE/Zell scholarship
 - Be eligible to receive institutional scholarships
 - o Be eligible for federal loans, grants, and work study

Scholarships

- Students are notified about scholarships in various ways (located in Naviance, weekly announcements at WHS, through the senior newsletter, through Infinite Campus email blasts, on the Facebook page, posted outside Counseling office)
- Important to set aside time to apply for scholarships.
- CollegeBoard Opportunity Scholarship

Ordering cap and gown

- Information posted in Cat Chat and Infinite Campus blast
- Important to enter the height and weight of the graduating student for correct gown sizing
- Orders now through 10-31-23: \$135
- Orders placed 11-1-23 through 1-31-24: \$145
- Orders placed 2-1-24 through 4-19-24: \$160
- The fee covers cap and gown, diploma cover, security at graduation, sound system, graduation programs, etc.
