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# What is Title I

Fayetteville Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

Title I is a federally funded program designed to ensure that all children have the opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach grade-level proficiency.

Fayetteville Elementary receives funding based on a free and reduced lunch count which is approximately 35%.

This funding is used to close the achievement gap for students of all socioeconomic backgrounds. Title I provides funds to ensure that all students have what they need to be successful.

## What is Parent & Family Engagement

Family Engagement is the participation of parents and family members in regular, two-way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, ensuring:

1. Parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning, partnering with the school, by attending Title 1 meetings, events, workshops.
2. Parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education.
3. Parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision making and advisory.

## Jointly Developed

The Parent and Family Engagement Plan is developed collaboratively with parent and staff input captured via Family Advisory Committee meetings, annual stakeholders meetings, workshops, and feedback from surveys



## Annual Evaluation

Fayetteville Elementary will conduct an end-of-year Title I Stakeholders meeting in May 2023. This meeting is an opportunity to evaluate the content and effectiveness of the parent and family engagement policy in improving academic outcomes. The Title I team will use the findings of such evaluation to design evidence-based strategies for more effective parental involvement.

# Reservation of Funds

At least 1% of Title I funds received are set aside for parent and family engagement. Specifically, those funds are used for:

- Resources for the Parent Center (STEAM related resources, activities/programming, parenting resources, science, reading and math Literacy games, hands on interactive learning manipulatives and books that promote academic achievement)
- Interpreter Tools
- Family Engagement Workshops/Meetings (Reading, Science, STEAM, Math, Informational, Supportive, Input, and committees)
- Parent Liaison and Interpreter funding



## Building Staff and Family Capacity

Fayetteville Elementary will perform meaningful and strategic actions to build parent and staff capacity to improve student achievement and promote academic success.

### Staff Capacity

- Communicate with staff about student progress
- Provide additional learning materials to staff for students to take home
- Provide flyers/notifications to staff regarding family events/workshops
- Collaborate with staff on topics for literacy workshops/meetings and FES field trips/events
- Attend PTO events and collaborate with PTO, participating in school-wide events to educate families on the importance of parent engagement and provide educational resources at PTO school functions
- Collaborate with other Fayette County Title I schools and liaisons (i.e. Middle school initiatives)

### Parent Capacity

- Facilitate Family Workshops
- Facilitate Literacy Workshops for parents of English Language Learners (ELLs)
- Establish and collaborate with community partners to obtain resources to support families (library, food bank, Lowe's)
- Conduct quarterly meetings with Family Advisory Committee
- Update Parent Engagement website (Title I) with Resources, workshop videos, and links to further enhance family engagement
