What is Advanced Placement?

- Sponsored by College Board and created by a collaboration between by college professors and high school teachers
- College level coursework completed at SMHS that satisfies high school credit requirements as well as college credit requirements

Benefits

- Exposure to rigorous, college-level curriculum
- Opportunity to earn college credit
- Enhanced college attractiveness
- College tuition savings
- Competitive edge for scholarship dollars

AP vs. Dual Enrollment

Advanced Placement

- Final grade includes an additional quality point for G.P.A. formula
- Easier accessibility to the instructor
- Calendar is the same as Fayette County
- Post-secondary schools encourage students to explore all "on-campus options"
- College credit is based on exam score and differs by institution
- Year-long courses

Dual Enrollment

- No impact on college HOPE hours
- Cost for lab classes
- Uses letter grading (A=95, B=85, C=75, D=70, W=69)
- Class rank impacted due to grade maximum
- Student must provide transportation
- Calendar is different from Fayette County
- Semester-long courses

AP Exams

- Standardized exam written by College Board given at end of course in May
- Serves as the final exam for spring semester; however, there may also be an EOC
- Students are <u>required</u> to take the exam and pay exam fees (currently \$94 per exam except AP Seminar and AP Research)
 - Current Year- one STEM exam free
- AP Tests are graded on a scale of 1-5
- Score of 3, 4, or 5 signifies that the student is qualified to receive college credit (check with individual schools for specifics)


Requesting an AP Class

- Eligible classes are listed under the "Next Year Qualifications" Tab in Infinite Campus, available on January 25
- Review the Course Expectations
- Complete, sign, and submit AP Agreement Contract to Office of Student Success.
- Enter an AP Course "Request" in Academic Planner.
- Discuss with counselor during advisement Sessions

AP Agreement Deadlines

- Rising 12th Graders- January 25th
- Rising 11th Graders- February 1st
- Rising 10th Graders- February 15th
- Rising 9th Graders- February 5th

Next steps for AP registration

Once approved for a 2024-2025 AP Course:

- Parents and students must sign and submit the AP acceptance and agreement form by June 1st.
- Students may add or drop AP courses until June 1, 2024. After that day, no AP courses will be added or removed from student schedules for any reason.
- Students are expected to complete all summer assignments for their enrolled course prior to returning for the 2024-2025 school year. Failure to complete summer assignments will not result in removal from the course but will impact the student's grade.
