FROM THE OFFICE OF THE ADMINISTRATION:

PARKING LOT WARNING FROM LEXINGTON CIRCLE SHOPPING CENTER: It has become very apparent that some students are parking in the parking lot for the shopping center across the street and walking over to the high school. This is a private property and the management company has informed MHS that students are not allowed to leave their cars in the parking lot for the duration of the school day. This has a direct impact on several of the tenants as they are getting complaints about the parking lot being full. The property owner has contacted us stating: "we will start stickering the cars and then towing if this continues to happen".

PARKING: Students with parking permits can only park in un-numbered spots. The numbered spots are for faculty/staff and visitors. Students can only park on campus if she/he has a current parking permit that is displayed properly. Golf carts can only be parked in designated spaces and should never obstruct the flow of traffic.

OUTSIDE FAST FOOD: Please remember that only homemade lunches may be dropped off at the front office for pick up by students. Fast food lunches may NOT be delivered to the school. In addition, students should not bring containers/drinks from outside vendors during the school day. Students are allowed to drink water in a bottle or seal-able tumbler in classrooms. All other food and drink is prohibited.

FROM THE COUNTY OFFICE:

REGARDING UBER/LYFT: Anyone under the age of 18 must have a parent or guardian with them when they ride in an Uber or Lyft, and car seats are required as well for small children and infants. If the Uber or Lyft driver is a relative of the student, that person should be on the contact list in IC, and the same procedures for pick up in the office or in the car line should be followed.
