WHAT IS TITLE I?

MISSION: The mission of Title I is to provide supplemental services and resources to assist students in achieving local learning goals and targets.

Since 1965 and the passage of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act and the newly adopted Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), Title I provides a source of federal funding to America's schools. Based on local data and demographics, Title I formulas determine the funding allocation allowing schools to provide supplemental instructional services and resources to assist students in achieving local learning goals and targets.

There are two models of Title I services, targeted assistance and school-wide, allowed under the 2001 No Child Left Behind Act. Schools are eligible to implement supplemental instructional services as targeted programs. Ensuring all students in the school, primarily those who are at-risk, satisfy expected achievement levels on local and state measures, remain the goal of school-wide programming. We have 7 schools with school-wide programs.

Title I requires schools complete a Comprehensive Needs Assessment (CNA), design specific goals and interventions to respond to the needs, develop a School Improvement Plan (SIP) and conduct an annual review of the program.

INSTRUCTION

Title I, Part A identifies students experiencing academic difficulties and provides timely assistance to help them meet the state's rigorous content standards.

Title I can fund supplemental staff and purchase supplemental evidence-based programs, materials, and supplies to support the academic achievement of students.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Title I, Part A reserves at least 1% of allotted funds for parental involvement. Parental Involvement ensures that strong strategies are in place to:

1. Build the capacity to involve parents/stakeholders in an effective partnership with the school; and
2. Share and support high student academic achievement.



PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

Title I, Part A reserves at least 5% of allotted funds to improve teaching and learning for disadvantaged students through data-driven and needs-based professional learning opportunities for teachers and staff.
