What is Title I?

Cleveland Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESSA). The purpose of Title I is to ensure that each child has a fair and equal opportunity at a high-quality education. Title I supports state and local reform efforts and enhances teaching and learning. The focus of our program is improving student achievement while also supporting family engagement.

Jointly Developed

Shared Decision Making & Use of Funds

We believe a strong school-home relationship is instrumental to student growth. Therefore, we strive to provide multiple opportunities for shared decision making. Thank you for participating in our surveys, Title 1 meetings, discussions, conferences, and other school-home communication opportunities. Your voice is critical to the development of our school wide improvement and family engagement plans and your input helps us plan instructional programming, purchase resources, and support you and your child. In addition, one percent (1%) of our Title I funds are spent on parent involvement, and we value your input.

Coordination of Services

We work to ensure that our programs coordinate and integrate with other Federal, State, and Local Programs. We want to help families transition to the next school level by partnering with public and private preschools, as well as Bennett's Mill and Flat Rock Middle Schools.

Cleveland School Goals 2023-2024

- During the 2023-2024 SY, we will improve Tier One instruction, thereby increasing student engagement and academic achievement.
- During the 2023-2024 SY, students will demonstrate academic growth on identified district benchmark assessments. 57% of 3rd - 5th grade students will score at the level 3 or 4 on the ELA and Mathematics Milestones assessments by May of 2024.
- During the 2023-2024 SY, we will enhance our school culture by ensuring a safe and healthy learning environment as measured by the state and school base climate survey.
- During the 2023-2024 SY, we will reduce the number of students with excessive absences to 17% to ensure access to learning opportunities for all students.
