The Role of the Parental Involvement Advisory Council:

- Help review and confirmed the Parental Engagement Policy/Plan
- Act as an advocate for the Parent Engagement Program
- Train parents to enhance the engagement of other parents

Parent Advisory Councils (PAC) Each Title I school is required to have a Title I Parent Advisory Council (PAC). The Parent Liaison will serve as chair of the Title I PAC. The PAC will develop a Title I Parent & Family Engagement Plan and School-Family Compact. PAC members are expected to attend annual Title I meetings. This affords the PAC the opportunity to learn more about Title I and begins a communication process between parents/teachers/school administrators. The PAC plans and carries out other Title I programs throughout the school year.

Goals and Objectives

1. To ensure effective involvement of all parents of Title I participating children and to support the partnership between other school community stakeholders (school administration and staff, Parent Teacher Organization and School Leadership Team).
2. To involve parents of Title I participating students in an organized and timely manner with the planning, review and implementation of Title I programs and the joint development of the school Family Engagement policy and the School-Family compact.
3. To recruit parents of Title I participating students for involvement in professional development opportunities, meetings, conferences and other related activities designed to enhance the role of parents in supporting the education of their children and advancing their own educational needs.
4. To provide information to parents of Title I participating students regarding Title I issues, and in consultation with other parents to bring questions, concerns, and ideas regarding Title I related issues to the attention of school staff, administration and other school community stakeholders.
5. To develop a spending plan in consultation with other parents of Title I participating students recommending how the school's minimum Title I 1% parent involvement allocation can be best utilized to support the needs of all Title I parents.
